Checklist when purchasing a plastic canoe, kayak or sit-on-top for fishing

Construction & Materials

Does the plastic contain adequate UV stabiliser to protect the material during sun exposure in Australian conditions?**

What is the manufacturer's warranty and are there any important disclaimers?**

** The paddling community has become aware of kayaks being sold that do not contain UV stabilisers in the plastic. This is usually indicated by signage telling people not to leave the product in the sun.

In Australia, UV exposure is very high & the use of UV stabilisers in the plastic is essential to ensure longevity of your kayak.

How thick is the wall of the hull, and will it flex to absorb any bumps into rocks and logs?

Has the kayak been finished off properly (no sharp edges where you could cut yourself)?

Has the sit-on kayak been pressure tested to ensure maximum safety?

Is the plastic weldable if you do get a hole in it?

What back-up service is available if you encounter problems?

Are you able to select your own colour or do you have to choose from a limited range?

Design

Is there enough volume to safely carry the weight of yourself and your extras?

Is the seat wide enough for you to sit in comfort for an extended period of time?

Has it been designed correctly to biomechanical standards to minimise risk of injury?

Is the hull design suitable for the type of water you will be paddling on?

What features are standard inclusions and what are options you will pay extra for?

Do you have to take the manufacturer's fishing package or can you fit out a blank kayak to suit your preferences and requirements?

Are anchor points moulded-in (for maximum water-tightness) or drilled and then riveted or screwed (creating potential leak points)?

Accessories

Is a paddle included in the price, and can you upgrade to a better one without penalty?

Are the accessories you want available from the manufacturer, or will you have to adapt other products to suit?

When rod holders are added, is there a silicon seal between the rod holder & kayak?

Are spare parts readily available for repairs or upgrading your canoe, kayak or sit-on-top?
